Day 1 (D)

Morning departure from Minneapolis-Saint Paul International Airport via scheduled airline service to New Orleans, Louisiana

Morning or afternoon arrival to the Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport

Meet your full-time local Tour Managers (*I full-time Tour Manager, per motorcoach*) who will remain with you for your entire time in New Orleans and will guide you through the duration of your activities

Lunch, on own

Enjoy an orientation tour of New Orleans that includes the French Quarter, Frenchman Street, Jackson Square – a National Historic Landmark nestled in the center of the French Quarter, the historic St. Louis Cathedral – the oldest Cathedral in North America and the Cabildo – once the site of the Louisiana Purchase transfer and now home to the Louisiana State Museum. Also enjoy the Royal Street Promenade – one of the original streets of the city, dating from the early 18th century, well known today for its antique shops, quaint markets, and art famous galleries

Afternoon hotel check-in with free-time to relax and freshen up

Evening included dinner with live jazz music at a local restaurant (i.e. Palm Court Jazz Café, The Maison, Mulates, or similar)

Return to the hotel for overnight

Day 2 (B,D)

Breakfast included at the hotel

Morning visit to Tulane University, the most famous university in Louisiana. Alumni include twelve governors of Louisiana; one Chief Justice of the United States; numerous members of Congress, including three Speaker of the House; four Surgeon Generals of the United States, 25 Marshall Scholars, 19 Rhodes Scholars, 17 Truman Scholars, over 160 Fulbright Scholars, and a former President of Costa Rica

Lunch, on own (if you want a local recommendation, grab a muffuletta at Central Grocery – where the Superdome-shaped sandwich, filled with cured meats, cheese and olive dressing, was invented. Grab one to-go and eat it from a bench on the bank of the Mississippi River where you can watch ships on the river go by)

Attend a private evening Jazz Concert at Preservation Hall*

Enjoy a Private Concert and Q & A with the Preservation Hall Jazz Ensemble. Established in 1961 to honor one of America's truest art forms - Traditional New Orleans Jazz, this hall and the jazz musicians who perform here serve as a cornerstone of New Orleans music and culture.

Return to the hotel for overnight

Day 3 (B,D)

Enjoy a Jazz Brunch – Breakfast Buffet at the legendary Court of Two Sisters Time permitting, enjoy some additional free-time in the downtown French Quarter area – the vibrant heartbeat of New Orleans' central district Lunch, on own

Afternoon Louis Armstrong tour. This walking tour takes visitors on the important historic sites related to Louis Armstrong's life in New Orleans. The tour begins in the French Quarter and includes historic sites where he stayed, worked, studied and played as an adult. It continues to the Storyville/Basin Street area where he worked as a youth, and then continues to the "back o town" section of the Central Business District where he grew up

Dinner included aboard the Creole Queen, the authentic Paddle-wheeler Mississippi River Cruise
